





IRONBRIDGE PROJECT

Challenges

- Covid
- Heat
- Location
- Terrain

- High client expectations







Before growing slightly bigger





- Engaged with the Nyamal People
- Over time expanding to a team of thirty-three over many job fronts







Busy Season

- Huge number of animals moving in peak breading season
- Averaging over 100 fauna rescues a day
- Busiest day the team rescued around 200 animals





We literally had our hands full







And then the wet season hit





Bringing with it some unpleasant surprises...









Diversity

- Over 100 species
- Venomous snakes
- Lizards big and small









And even the unusual





Helping hands

- Working closely with construction
- Construction crew's efforts to help out and support positive environment outcomes





- On the project we've rescued over 1100 snakes
- In June alone we removed 328 snakes from the trench, 90% were venomous





Environmentally conscious decisions

- Rehab of rocky area at KP18
- Saving the habitat tree of nesting Australian Ringneck Parrots at 6-mile creek
